CANADA-PERU FREE TRADE AGREEMENT (CPFTA) RULES OF ORIGIN

Regulations

RULES OF ORIGIN

1. The following provisions of the Free Trade Agreement between Canada and the Republic of Peru, signed on May 29, 2008, have the force of law in Canada:

- (a) Articles 301 to 305;
- (b) Article 306, paragraphs 1 and 2;
- (c) Articles 307 to 315;
- (d) Article 318; and
- (e) Annex 301.

COMING INTO FORCE

2. These Regulations come into force on the day on which section 36 of the *Canada-Peru Free Trade Agreement Implementation Act*, chapter 16 of the *Statutes of Canada, 2009*, comes into force.

2. Chapter Three: Rules of Origin contains the general rules of origin that set out the criteria to determine the originating status of a good, as well as other general conditions and requirements.

3. Annex 301: Specific Rules of Origin sets out the product specific rules of origin that establish the point at which materials or components have undergone sufficient production within the free trade area for the good produced to be considered originating.
